### Instructions to Authors

Revelation – A Journal of Popular Science, published annually by Vigyan Parishad, Shri Jai Narain P.G. College is a multi-disciplinary, peer reviewed, refereed, popular science journal started in 2015. Submission from all fields of Science are welcome. Papers must be written clearly in British English, in an organized way and must not have been published or communicated elsewhere. The submitted paper will be first assessed by the editors and members of the reviewing committee of the concerned subject. All rights of final acceptance or rejection of the paper will remain with the Editor in Chief of the journal. **Plagiarised articles will be summarily rejected.** Manuscripts are to be submitted online to [revelation.jnpg@gmail.com](mailto:revelation.jnpg@gmail.com). Articles are to be submitted giving names, addresses, telephone numbers and email - of all the authors.

1. A files should be submitted as word document, in Times New Roman, 12 font size.
2. Research Articles should be between 5000 and 10,000 words in length. This includes all text including references, abstract and appendices. The manuscript should be typed, double spaced throughout and with a size margin of 1" at the top, bottom and both sides of each page.
3. The first page of the Research article should include the title of the articles, author's name, affiliation, address and contact numbers.
4. Abstract should be between 150-250 words in total (including keywords).
5. Objective and methodology of the research article should be clearly defined in the introduction.

6. Tables should be typed and included in a separate file to the main body of the article. The position of each table could be clearly labeled in the body text of article with corresponding labels being clearly shown in the separate file.
7. The references in the paper should be based on APA style of publication. The following examples are given below :

### **Categories of Manuscripts**

1. Research Articles (not exceeding 4000 words) are expected to present major advance in scientific discipline.
2. General Articles (not exceeding 2500 words) include application of science and technology to social and human needs, impact of scientific advancements on ecosystem/quality of life etc.
3. Research News (not exceeding 1000 words) would include information for non-technical or general public about scientific advance during the past one year.
4. Correspondence (not exceeding 500 words) includes letters containing lectures, comments and discussions regarding latest scientific discoveries including articles recently published in previous issues of *New Horizons*.
5. Book Reviews (not exceeding 1500 words) include review of recently published scientific books
